I wish them and you much success in your efforts to have an outstanding Festival.





Bethlehem, Pennsylvania

'T was the night before Christmas in the year 1741 — just 225 years ago — that a group of Moravian settlers gathered in a crude log cabin in the Pennsylvania wilderness to observe the Vigils of Christmas Eve. Taking their lead from the words of a German chorale which they had brought with them to the New World, the settlers chose the name "Bethlehem" for their new home.

With a population of over 76,000, and currently Pennsylvania's fastest growing community, Bethlehem is located in the heart of the Lehigh Valley. Philadelphia lies 50 miles to the south, and New York City, 90 miles to the east. One-third of the entire population of the United States is contained within 300 miles of the Lehigh Valley.

Bethlehem is pre-eminent in Industry, Education, Religion, Music, and Recreation. These established endeavors, which are symbolized in the five points of the "Star", Bethlehem's official seal, reflect the sense of accomplishment of her citizens. Here is the home of the Bethlehem Steel Corporation, Lehigh University, Moravian College, and the renowned Bethlehem Bach Choir.
