
GREETINGS:



Gioacchino Antonio Rossini, 1792-1868, had an extraordinary career in many ways. Unusually gifted by nature, he stopped studying the moment his teacher assured him that he knew enough to write operas. He began to turn out theatrical works in rapid succession, achieved fame and financial success, and ceased to compose shortly after he reached the age of thirty-five. His overtures are often played by concert bands and are referred to as "the famous five". They include BARBER OF SEVILLE, WILLIAM TELL, ITALIAN IN ALGIERS, LA GAZZA LADRA, and SEMIRAMIDE.

THE GALLANT SEVENTH *Sousa*
THE GALLANT SEVENTH (1922), regarded as one of Sousa's finest and certainly one of the most vigorous of his 136 marches, was composed while he was recuperating from a broken neck. The march takes its title from the 7th Regiment, 107 Infantry, of the New York National Guard.

THE U.S. FIELD ARTILLERY MARCH (1917) contains an old artillery song, "The Caissons Go Rolling Along" in the trio. Mr. Sousa's march achieved tremendous popularity and financial success. It became a theme song for the U.S. Army, in particular, the U.S. Field Artillery. The time-honored manuscript of his original march now hangs in the library of the U.S. Army Artillery and Missile School at Fort Sill, Oklahoma.

Bethlehem, Pennsylvania

A Christmas candle in every window remains a 20th century reminder of the thoughts of those who named Bethlehem on Christmas Eve in 1741. From the singing of hymns in the first log house, to the first community orchestra in 1744, to the present emphasis on music in its public schools, Bethlehem has always placed good music high on the list of human enjoyments.

With a population of over 75,000 Bethlehem is located in the heart of the Lehigh Valley. Philadelphia lies 50 miles to the south, and New York City, 90 miles to the east. One-third of the entire population of the United States is contained within 300 miles of the Lehigh Valley.

Bethlehem's Industry, Religion, Music, and Recreation are symbolized in the five points of the "star", Bethlehem's official seal. These endeavors reflect the sense of accomplishment of her citizens. The City is the home of the Bethlehem Steel Corporation, Lehigh University, Moravian College, and the renowned Bethlehem Bach Choir.
