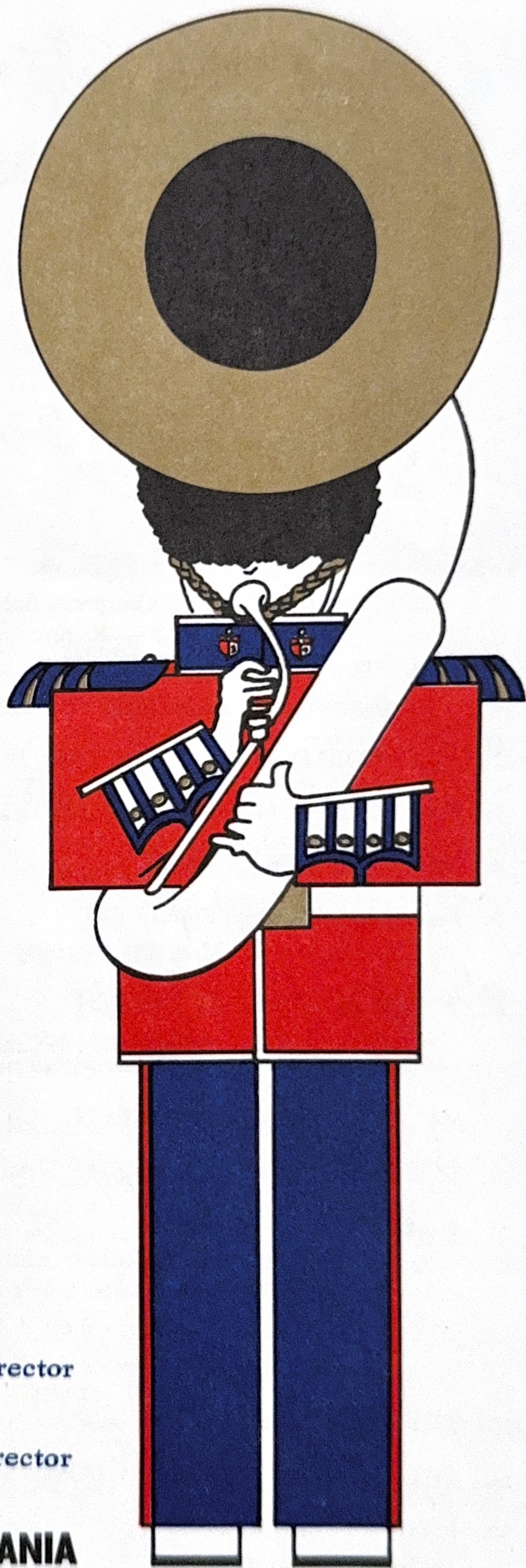

PROGRAM NOTES
JOHANN SEBASTIAN BACH

There is no greater name in the history of music than that of Bach. The Bach family, from 1560 to 1800, presented the world with no less than seven generations of musicians. Its genius reached its highest development in the fourth generation with the works of Johann Sebastian, the dominant musician of the era, and one of the artistic giants of history.

Bach wrote two Fugues in G Minor. Both were written for organ. They are usually referred to, for purposes of identification, as the "Great Fugue" and the "Little Fugue." The band's brilliant arrangement of Bach's Little Fugue is by Lucien Cailliet, arranger for the Goldman Band and former member of the Philadelphia Orchestra.

JOHN PHILIP SOUSA

"Solid Men to the Front!" is regarded by scholars as one of Sousa's better efforts. It was also among his own favorites. Dr. Frank Simon, one of the Sousa Band's stellar cornet soloists, recalled Sousa's conducting mannerisms when the band played it: "I could tell by the way he conducted it that he was really wrapped up in his own hard-hitting melodies."

"Sempre Fidelis" takes its title from the motto of the U.S. Marine Corps: "Sempre Fidelis — Always Faithful." On the first performance, Sousa wrote: "We are marching down Pennsylvania Avenue, and had turned the corner at the Treasury Building. On the reviewing stand were President Harrison, many members of the diplomatic corps, a large part of the House and Senate, and an immense number of invited guests. I had so timed our playing of the march that the trumpet theme would be heard for the first time, just as we got to the front of the reviewing stand. Suddenly 10 extra trumpets were shot in the air, and the 'theme' was pealed out in unison. Nothing like it had ever been heard before — when the great throng on the stand had recovered its surprise, it rose in a body, and led by the President himself, showed its pleasure in a mighty swell of applause. It was a proud moment for us all.
