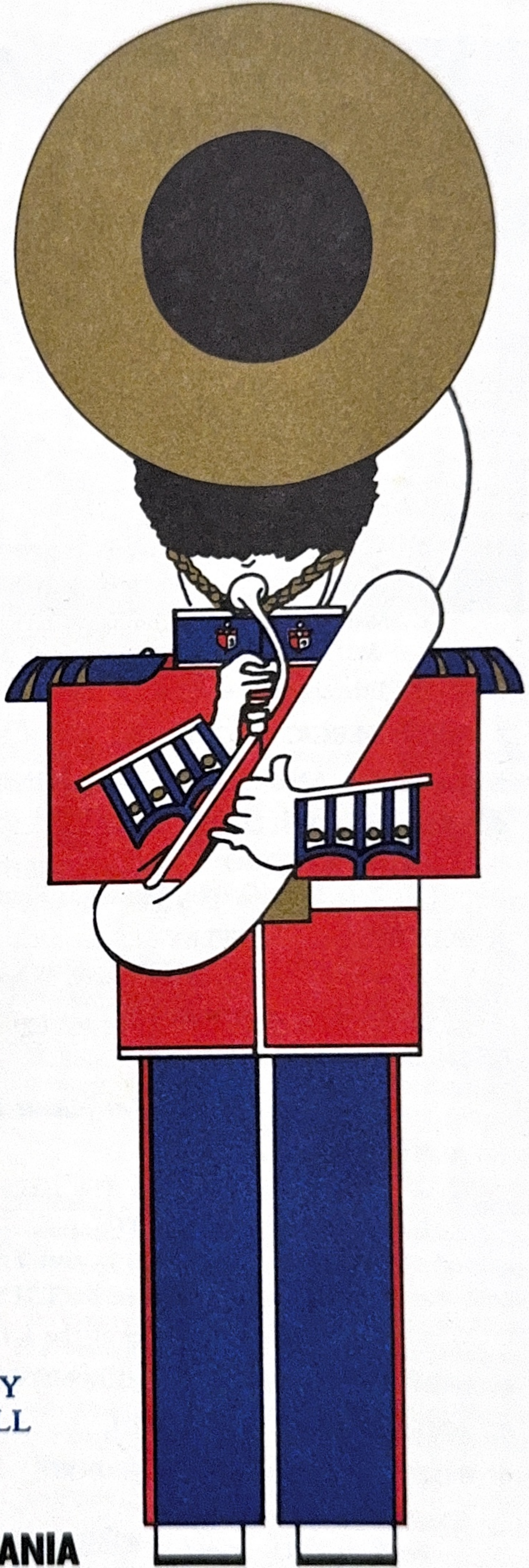

PROGRAM NOTES

PETER TSCHAIKOWSKY

Tschaikowsky's sixth and last symphony was written in 1893 — the year of his death. The fiery March is based on a little theme of two bars, which is worked up into a stirring and brilliant movement, worthy of being regarded as one of Tschaikowsky's finest achievements.

JOHN PHILIP SOUSA

Sousa wrote 136 marches. The number is much greater if we add other march melodies found in his suites and operettas.

POWHATAN'S DAUGHTER (1907) is one of Mr. Sherry's favorites. It was the march that first endeared Sousa to the Indians of America. It was a salute to Pocahontas, daughter of Chief Powhatan, and was written for the Jamestown Exposition of 1907.

THE NATIONAL GAME (1925) Judge Kenesaw Landis, baseball's high commissioner, asked Sousa to compose this march on the occasion of the National League's Fiftieth anniversary. Sousa had much enthusiasm for the game and the Sousa Band had it's own baseball team.

SEMPER FIDELIS (1888)

"Sempre Fidelis" takes its title from the motto of the U.S. Marine Corps: "Sempre Fidelis — Always Faithful." On the first performance, Sousa wrote: "We are marching down Pennsylvania Avenue, and had turned the corner at the Treasury Building. On the reviewing stand were President Harrison, many members of the diplomatic corps, a large part of the House and Senate, and an immense number of invited guests. I had so timed our playing of the march that the trumpet theme would be heard for the first time, just as we got to the front of the reviewing stand. Suddenly 10 extra trumpets were shot in the air, and the 'theme' was pealed out in unison. Nothing like it had ever been heard before — when the great throng on the stand had recovered its surprise, it rose in a body, and led by the President himself, showed its pleasure in a mighty swell of applause. It was a proud moment for us all.
