## THE '94 LONDON TOUR

This March 24-30, the Liberty High School Grenadiers will travel to London to perform in joint concert with Her Majesty's Band of the Coldstream Guards. The Liberty High School Grenadier Band remains the only high school band to ever play with the Coldstream Band, or for that matter, any band of the Queen's Household Division.

Trip highlights will include: a parade through Guildford, England; rehearsal with the Coldstream in the Guards' historic home, Wellington Barracks; attending Andrew Lloyd Weber's dazzling musical, "Starlight Express"; sightseeing in London; and a full-day excursion to Canterbury and Hever Castle. The seven day tour will culminate with the two bands' joint performance in the Guildford Civic Theater, on March 27, 1994.

*The following profile of the Liberty High School Grenadier Band is an excerpt from the Guildford Theater program, exactly as it will appear to our British audience:*

### THE GRENADIER BAND OF LIBERTY HIGH SCHOOL:

The students of the Grenadier Band of Liberty High School represent a long tradition of devotion to good music. Their hometown, Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, was founded by a group of Moravian missionaries in 1741, who instilled and nurtured a love of music within the community. Today, this city of 80,000 provides abundant opportunity to enjoy music of all kinds through performances by musical groups of its two high schools, two colleges and numerous civic organizations. The Liberty Grenadiers enjoy a tremendously broad-based support from the Liberty Band Parents Organization, school district administrators and officials, and the community at large.

In 1926, Mr. Joseph Recapito began what later would become the famous Grenadier Band. Recapito served as the band's director until his retirement in 1961 when Mr. Ronald Sherry assumed leadership. Sherry redesigned the band's image and style to that of the noted military bands of Great Britain. His particular zeal for the Band of the Coldstream Guards remains most evident. In 1990, Mr. Gregory MacGill, Sherry's assistant for 12 years, became director. MacGill, along with Assistant Director Kevin Long, continue to build the Grenadiers' rich musical traditions.

Although the group is named the Grenadier Band, it uses as its model the outstanding Band of the Coldstream Guards. The Grenadiers' uniforms are authentic copies of those worn by the Coldstream. Other British military band traditions such as leopard skins, drum aprons, and an independent bagpipe unit are also incorporated. As with the pipers, the young ladies in the Majorette Squad and Highland Dancers wear Royal Stewart tartan. The Color Guard, averaging six feet

in height before donning their bearskin hats, carries authentic Enfield rifles and a genuine Wilkinson Sword.


Entry into the band is determined by audition. A member's chair placement may be challenged at any time by another member. The expansive, solid ranks of instrumentalists has always been a trademark of the 230 member band. Their repertoire alternates through American marches, pop tunes, classical selections, and British band music. In parade, the band's adopted themes, "Rule Britannia" and "Milanollo" (Regimental March - Coldstream Guards) are always performed in the line-up. The Bagpipe Unit, acting independently of the band, enables Liberty to perform almost continuously in parades.

Over the years, the Grenadiers have been very successful in field, concert, and parade competitions throughout the United States and Canada. Among the bands hundreds of awards are: four-time winner of the prestigious Governor's Cup at the Festival of States in Florida; ten Miss America parades; three Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parades; Indianapolis 500 Parade; Kentucky Derby Parade; and festivals in Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, and Vancouver, British Columbia. In addition, the band has performed at 28 U. S. professional football/baseball games. On July 6, 1976, the Liberty High School Grenadier Band provided all the music for Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II in Philadelphia on the occasion of Her presentation of the Bicentennial Bell as a gift from Great Britain to the American people. Liberty's first overseas tour occurred in March 1986 when the band traveled to England, distinguishing itself as the first American high school band to perform in Royal Albert Hall and to play in joint concert with the Band of the Coldstream Guards.


A fine rapport has continued to flourish between the two bands. In 1988, Major Roger Swift, former Director of Music, Coldstream Guards, accepted an invitation to guest conduct at Liberty's annual Spring concert in Bethlehem. During the Coldstream's 1991 North American tour, Liberty surprised Major David Marshall, present Director of Music, Coldstream Guards, and his exceptional musicians with a musical welcome upon their arrival in Bethlehem. And in the summers of 1992 and 1993, Sgt. Gale Lawson, senior member of the Coldstream Band, was granted special leave to fly to Bethlehem and work with the Liberty Grenadiers.

Assisting in the efforts of Mr. MacGill and Mr. Long is Miss Jane Kapsaslis, Majorette Advisor. The Student Senate is comprised of: Matt Balazs (Drum Major & President), David Zullo, Don Sabo, Rachel Miller (Pipe Major), Greg Stoffa (Pipe Sgt.) Jen Yencho (Head Majorette), and Wendy Krisak (Secretary).

The young ladies and gentlemen of the Liberty High School Grenadier Band have eagerly awaited this evening's concert, regarding it as an extraordinary opportunity to renew ties with the band that is "Second to None", the magnificent Band of the Coldstream Guards!

## **THE REGIMENTAL BAND OF THE COLDSTREAM GUARDS**

The Coldstream Guards originated in 1650 from the little market town of Coldstream, which is situated on the banks of the River Tweed. After a long march to London, as the Lord General's Regiment, they laid down their arms and took them up again in the name of the newly restored King Charles II as the Coldstream Guards.

From the earliest days the Regiment had drummers, and from 1742, a 'Band of Musik'. This was, in fact, eight civilian musicians who were hired by the month by Officers of the Regiment to provide the music for Changing of the Guard at St. James Palace. As their duties increased, the Duke of York, who was colonel to the Regiment, found it necessary to incorporate a band of twelve musicians within the Coldstream Guards. The date of this formation, May 16, 1785, officially marks the Coldstream Band's beginning.

From the original twelve, the Band now numbers forty-nine. The band is constantly in demand at home and abroad; but their first duty is as part of the Queen's Household Division in London, where they are required to play on all State, Court, and Ceremonial duties. These extend from performing for Changing of the Guard to Trooping the Colour for the Queen to welcoming the President of the United States, as well as other heads-of-state. In addition to undertaking engagements throughout the British Isles, the Coldstream Band has endeared themselves to the audiences around the world as worthy ambassadors of music. Their most recent tours of duty include: Japan, Hong Kong, Australia, Germany, and of course, North America.

After over two hundred years of unbroken service, the Coldstream has had many distinguished Directors of Music. Having had the privilege to serve under previous Director, Major Roger Swift, the Liberty High School Grenadiers look forward to working with present Director of Music, Major David Marshall. Like the Coldstream's Regimental motto, "Nulli Secundus", he and his exemplary musicians are "Second to None".
